Freedom of Information Act Request

Dear Mr. Wiszowaty:

Our law firm represents the Village of Sauk Village ("Village). Thank you for writing to the Village with your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA"), 5 ILCS 140/1 et seq. Your FOIA request seeks documents sufficient to show the name, age and address of the driver of said vehicle arrested last night involving his truck striking a house. Further, you requested any and all police incident report/s/ and any complaints/charges filed or being filed involving same incident.

Your FOIA request is partially granted and partially denied as follows. The Village is releasing the attached records to you at no charge. All other information pertaining to your request is attached. However, the records contain information that is exempt from disclosure under the following exemption in FOIA.

- 1. **7(1)(b)**: Home addresses (person not arrested), personal telephone numbers, personal vehicle information (i.e. VIN number and license plate number), driver's license numbers. Section 7(1)(b) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]rivate information, unless disclosure is required by another provision of [FOIA], a State or federal law or a court order." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b).
- 2. **7(1)(c)**: Victim's names and dates of birth. Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained in public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy". 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The above-referenced information is highly personal, and the subjects' right to privacy with respect to this information outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining it.



3. 7(1)(d)(iv): Names of witnesses and other information that if disclosed would unavoidably disclose the identities of people who have filed complaints with law enforcement. Section 7(1)(d)(iv) exempts from inspection and copying records in the possession of law enforcement created for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that disclosure would "unavoidably disclose the identity of a confidential source, confidential information furnished only by the confidential source, or persons who file complaints with or provide information" to law enforcement. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(d)(iv).

You also have the right to seek judicial review of the denial under Section 11 of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act.

While at SVPD, Bud's Ambulance Service was contacted to treat the male, now identified as John Strickland, for possible injuries sustained in the vehicle accident. When Bud's arrived at SVPD, Paramedics egan to take John's information and vital signs and he advised Bud's personnel he had taken PCP tonight. Bud's personnel advised they would transport John to St. James hospital to be examined and when the booking holding cage was opened have Bud's personnel administer vital signs, John became combative with Officer Tomalis and attempted to force his way out of the holding cage. Officer Tomalis requested assistance from Officer Luke #128 and myself and we entered the booking room and observed Officer Tomalis in a struggle with John. John began to push his way towards the exit door, stating in essence but not verbatim "you aren't keeping me here." John repeatedly pushed officers and refused to be placed back into the holding cage. John began to violently shove officers and Officer Luke deployed a drive stun from his X26 Taser with little to no effect. Officer Tomalis was able to apply one handcuff to John but we were unable to secure his second hand. John continued to struggle with officers, striking the secure exit door with enough force to force it open and attempted to exit the building in an attempt to escape. Officer Luke applied his Taser another time and officers took John to the ground and we were able resecure the door. John continued to struggle with officers and was able to stumble to the door and force the secure exit open again in another attempt to escape. Officers were able to take John to the ground just outside the building and secure his second hand and apply leg shackles. John was then placed back into the holding cage. John was drive stunned by Officer Tomalis and Officer Luke approximately four times during the struggle with little or no effect. When John began to calm down, he was transported to St. James Hospital for treatment, Officer Tomalis accompanied John and requested a blood/urine test be performed due to the accident with injuries. Bud's personnel were inside the booking room and witnessed the described events. While at the hospital, Officer Tomalis read John his warning to motorist at 0024 hours and later learned from hospital staff, John tested positive for cocaine, PCP and THC in his blood/urine test. Officers later learned John's Illinois drivers license was currently "suspended".

Prior to John being transported to the hospital, I responded to the scene of the initial crash, now located at 1815 Sauk Trail. I observed a red 1994 GMC Sierra pick-up truck bearing Illinois registration completely inside the south side of the residence (see attached pictures). The vehicle was also protruding the through the west wall, knocking the natural gas meter off, creating a significant natural gas leak. Sauk Village Fire Department stood by at the residence until ComEd and NICOR could arrive on scene to turn off their respective utilities. After the utilities were turned off, 3M Towing was able to remove and tow the vehicle and Rich Construction was contacted to board up the residence.

I learned a female occupant of the residence was transported to St. Margaret's Hospital in Dyer, Indiana for
treatment of injuries that occurred during the accident. I later responded to St. Margaret's Hospital and spoke with the
female, now identified as some states. I spoke with some who advised she had been asleep on a couch in the
living room at the front of the residence near the point of impact when she was awoken by the crash.

Margaret's personnel. The results of those tests are not known at this time. I advised crash report #U130521337 would be completed and a detective would contact her later in the day to learn the results of the exams. This case is being forwarded to investigations for review.
