

Notice to Sauk Village Residents: In recent months, the Sauk Village Police Department has been in contact with Kia America and the Hyundai Corporation concerning the vulnerability to theft of various Kia and Hyundai models. Public Works Department 2023 Village Schedule

Street Sweeping

The street sweeping schedule for the 2023 season will be as follows:

The week beginning- April 10, May 8, June 12, July 9, August 14, September 11, and October 19.

Sweeping in the month of November will follow our leaf pickup program. All sweep dates can change due to manpower and emergencies.

If additional sweepings are necessary, notification will be posted on the Marquee located on Sauk Trail at the corner of Cornell Ave and the village website.

The ordinance prohibits parking on the streets between the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. during the day of your garbage pickup.

Hydrant Flushing

Hydrants will be flushed in the following sections of town on the specified dates.

April 13, 14 - South Side of town; south of Sauk Trail & west of Torrence extending to Deer Creek.

May 4, 5 - North Side of town; north of Sauk Trail extending to Carlisle Estates

June 1, 2 - Eastern section of town; located east of Torrence & south of Sauk Trail

July 6, 7 - South Side of town; south of Sauk Trail & west of Torrence extending to Deer Creek

August 3, 4 - North Side of town; north of Sauk Trail extending to Carlisle Estates

September 7, 8 - Eastern Section of town; located east of Torrence & south of Sauk Trail

October 5, 6 - South Side of town; south of Sauk Trail & west of Torrence extending to Deer Creek

Actual flushing will begin at 8 A.M. and continuing through the day, all unflushed hydrants will be completed the next day.

Residents should refrain from washing whites during flushing and for at least 24 to 48 hours after flushing. If you experience discolored water, run the cold water in the bathtub until clear. All flush dates can change due to manpower and emergencies.

Tree Limb Pickup

The first pickup for the 2023 season will be the 1st week (Monday- Friday) of the following months, May-October begins Monday, May 1, and end on Friday, October 6th.

Residents are asked to have limbs out no later than Sunday before the 1st Monday of the month.

The final pickup for the 2023 season will begin Monday, October 2 and end Friday, October 6th at 2 PM.

Residents are asked to have limbs out no later than Sunday the day before the 1st Monday of May-October.

Remember to bundle small branches and to stack branches neatly in the same direction as this

speeds the tree limb pickup. There will be no branches picked up after these dates no exceptions

Any questions concerning the pickup dates please call Village Hall (758-3330) Monday through

Friday 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. If there is a special pickup it will be posted on the village Marquee and website.

Leaf Sweep Program

The leaf pickup program will begin November 6th until November 22. Our final pickup will begin November 21; crews will be out to pick up each section on garbage day,


THEY WILL NOT COME BACK AFTER THIS PASS.

ABOUT THE VETERAN HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

Applications are open!

In partnership with Rebuilding Together Metro Chicago, Cook County has allocated \$1.25 million to complete free indoor and outdoor repairs to at least 15 veteran-owned homes each year for the next two years.

The veteran home repair program focuses on warm, safe and dry priorities or the need for home modification improvements. Low-income veteran homeowners will be prioritized.





Eligibility

This free program is available to Cook County veteran homeowners, dependent spouses or caretakers who provide housing for a veteran.


